Please find attached a letter which was forwarded to the Free Press in regards to comments made by Mayor Breckenridge in an article, dated January 26, 2007, "Wind of Change".

As stated in the letter to the Free Press, it is troubling that the Mayor is giving her opinions about signage and where the public can go on the beaches, contrary to a Press Release by the Township which states that "The signage and posting is only intended to ensure that members of the public can readily identify the extent of municipally owned lands, where they are visiting. This notice is not to be construed to be making any statement on the legal status of property not in municipal ownership."

1. I question, is the mayor making a statement on the legal status of property not in municipal ownership, and if so what information is she basing this statement on?
2. How is she best serving her "customers", the TAXPAYERS, by doing so?
3. As stated in the letter, is it not within her mandate to protect the public interest, including that of traditional & historic use to the beaches of Tiny?
4. Since beach access has been mentioned as a priority of Council, what plans do Council have regarding resolving this issue?
