Dear Mayor Klug & Members of Council:

Re: Proposal to pass a by-law to stop up, close and dispose of a portion of the Unopened Road Allowance Between Lots 23 & 24 (shown as Part 4) (Sandy Bay Road) and a portion of Block A, Registered Plan 1241, Concession 19W (shown as Parts 1 & 3) in the Township of Tiny, County of Simcoe

Save the Beaches, representing its many members, including those in the immediate areas of Concession 19, 20 and Sandy Bay Road, wishes to express its strong disapproval of the above proposal to stop of close and dispose of a portion of the Unopened Road Allowance.

The property in question is not surplus to the ratepayers of Tiny Township. As you are aware this unopened Road Allowance leads to the water's edge and is a much utilized beach access for Tiny's residents and the public. The applicant already has access to this public beach without the need to purchase land from the Township, therefore there is no logical purpose for this by-law to be passed.

In recent years, more and more property owners are finding means and ways to acquire Township lands and access points to the beach with disregard for the general public and residents of the municipality. The wishes of one property owner should not override the interests of the majority of Township ratepayers to protect ownership of access points and municipal properties along the shoreline in Tiny Township.

As a Council, the Municipal Act states that you are to represent the public and to consider the well being and interest of the municipality. The sale of public shoreline properties is negligent and only causes more distrust of Council and angst within the community over the beach access issue.

We respectfully request that Council listen to the concerns of its residents in this matter and we request further that Council do not approve the above mentioned by-law proposal.
